

REBUILD Motor Vehicle Studies

I. Brief

Rebuild will equip young offenders in London aged 16 – 18, in custody and in the community, with Level 1 qualification in automotive skills for an average of 13 weeks each.

Placements will be supplemented with mentoring and continuing support to ensure that the young people maintain momentum and stay confident, in order to remain in work or training.

REBUILD consists of 3 main components, each accredited:

- **Social and personal development** – addressing ongoing needs to build confidence and resilience, manifested by this vulnerable and volatile group.
- **Vocational and employability skills** – targeting automotive skills that promise real job opportunities.
- **Skills for life – including** - numeracy, literacy and ICT – meeting employers' requirements for basic competencies.

II. Delivery objectives: RBKC, Ealing, Hammersmith & Fulham, Hounslow and Islington.

1. Vocational programme in automotive skills (Go-Kart and Motorcycle – building) that bring in additional issues such as road safety vehicle crime, accident reduction as well as alcohol, drugs and personal safety. Literacy, numeracy and ICT elements are embedded in the leaning.
2. Needs-driven leaning support that addresses additional needs, especially those of females, the mentally and physically disabled, those with leaning difficulties or high levels of life skills and ESOL needs.
3. ICT components: alongside the identified ICT skills gap in the region, there is clear evidence that many learners find IT an accessible learning medium.
4. Personal development sessions that build confidence around job interviews and pro forma practice, social and professional teamwork, communication and coping skills, rights and responsibilities.
5. Mentoring programmes and one to one sessions offered through Senior then Peer Mentors under the supervision of a Mentoring manager that can help anticipate and work through personal and work issues.
6. Employment forums will prepare employers and potential employees by discussing skills and training issues. Relationships with Yamaha, Honda and Network Rail have already been forged.

This programme is ESF funded. Lunch and travel will be paid for.

A mainstream programme for learners 16+ only offering the Motor Vehicle Qualification is available with a cost. Full Fees: £364, Concessions: £64

E2E programme with EMA is also available for young people aged 16 – 19
